Early Learning and Child Care Regulation; Changes terminology relating to school readiness & family day care; revises certain requirements & standards relating to child care facilities, VPK program, & school readiness program; revises provisions relating to exemption from certain licensing standards; revises duties of Office of Early Learning & early learning coalitions. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Read second time and amended April 21

CS/HB 7083 by Education Committee, Choice & Innovation Subcommittee, Diaz, M., Artiles (Compare HB 7031, SB 1096, CS/CS/SB 1226)

School Choice; Revises charter school provisions relating to applications & contracts, termination of charter, student enrollment, payment & transfer of funds, use of school district facilities, & model forms, contracts, & evaluation instruments; revises provisions relating to high-performing charter schools & high-performing charter school systems; specifies conditions under which virtual instruction provider's contract is automatically terminated; revises eligibility for receipt of capital outlay funding. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

CS/CS/HB 355 by Education Committee, Higher Education & Workforce Subcommittee, Porter, Ahern, Saunders (Similar CS/SB 530)

Postsecondary Education Textbook and Instructional Materials Affordability; Requires SBE & BOG to adopt textbook & instructional materials affordability policies, procedures, & guidelines; provides requirements for use of adopted undergraduate textbooks & instructional materials; requires public postsecondary institution to post in course registration system & on website information relating to required & recommended textbooks & instructional materials & prices thereof; requires task force to research affordability issues. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

CS/CS/HB 1275 by Health & Human Services Committee, Select Committee on Health Care Workforce Innovation, Ahern, Baxley, Campbell, Eagle (Compare HB 501, SB 502, SB 1230, SB 1420)

Physician Assistants; Increases number of licensed physician assistants that physician may supervise at any one time; provides exception; revises circumstances under which physician assistant is authorized to prescribe or dispense medication; revises requirements for medications prescribed or dispensed by physician assistants; revises application requirements for licensure as physician assistant & license renewal; authorizes physician assistant who has completed specified education & clinical training requirements to perform nonablative aesthetic skin care services under supervision of physician; provides that physician must complete specified number of education &

clinical training hours to be qualified to supervise physician assistants performing certain services. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

CS/CS/SB 424 by Appropriations, Criminal Justice, Lee, Latvala (Similar CS/CS/HB 255)

Discriminatory Insurance Practices; Providing that unfair discrimination on the basis of gun ownership in the provision of personal lines property or personal lines automobile insurance is a discriminatory insurance practice; clarifying that insurers are not prevented from charging supplemental premiums or sharing information between an insurer and its agent if a separate rider has been requested, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

CS/HB 437 by Health Quality Subcommittee, Trujillo, Campbell, Cruz (Identical CS/SB 694)

Diabetes Advisory Council; Requires Diabetes Advisory Council, in conjunction with DOH, AHCA, & DMS to develop plans relating to diabetes management, treatment, & control; requires report to Governor & Legislature. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

CS/HB 785 by Regulatory Affairs Committee, Albritton (Identical CS/SB 952, Compare HB 471, CS/CS/HB 565, CS/SB 1260)

Workers' Compensation; Authorizes employers to negotiate retrospectively rated premium with insurers under certain conditions; provides exemption; provides requirements for filing & approval of such plans & associated forms; provides exception. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Read second time and amended April 21

HB 953 by Peters (Identical SB 914)

State Contracting; Revises criteria for evaluating proposal to include consideration of prior relevant experience of vendor; revising criteria for evaluating response to agency's invitation to negotiate to include consideration of prior relevant experience of vendor. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

CS/HB 781 by Civil Justice Subcommittee, Powell, Rooney (Identical CS/SB 834)

Legal Notices; Requires legal notices to be posted on newspaper's website on web pages with specified titles; prohibits charging fee or requiring registration for viewing online legal notices; establishing period for which legal notices are required to be published on statewide website; requires that legal notices be archived on statewide website for specified period; deletes provision relating to harmless error; clarifies payment provisions. Effective Date: October 1, 2014

SB 308 by Brandes (Identical HB 171)

Public Assistance Fraud; Authorizing the Department of Financial Services to administer oaths and affirmations and issue and serve subpoenas when conducting investigations into public assistance fraud; providing a penalty; providing for award of attorney fees and costs, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

Read second time April 21

CS/CS/CS/SB 242 by Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Judiciary, Commerce and Tourism, Detert (Similar CS/CS/HB 151)

Security of a Protected Consumer's Information; Citing this act as the "Keeping I.D. Safe (KIDS) Act"; authorizing the representative of a protected consumer to place a security freeze on a protected consumer report or record; prohibiting a consumer reporting agency from stating or implying that a security freeze reflects a negative credit history or rating; requiring a consumer reporting agency to remove a security freeze under specified conditions, etc. Effective Date: 09/01/2014

CS/CS/HB 629 by Regulatory Affairs Committee, Business & Professional Regulation Subcommittee, Boyd, Artiles, Eagle, Hager, Harrell (Similar CS/SB 638)

Charities; Revises provisions related to the solicitation of funds. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Read second time and amended April 21

CS/HB 535 by Health & Human Services Committee, Fullwood, Campbell, Van Zant, Williams, A. (Similar SB 552)

Transactions in Fresh Produce Markets; Authorizes certain owners & operators of farmers' markets, community farmers' markets, flea markets, & other open-air markets selling fresh produce to allow authorized Food & Nutrition Service groups, associations, & third-party organizations to operate EBT systems in such markets. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

CS/CS/HB 805 by Regulatory Affairs Committee, Insurance & Banking Subcommittee, Moraitis (Similar CS/SB 758, Compare CS/CS/HB 321, CS/CS/SB 570)

Title Insurer Reserves; Revises criteria with respect to liabilities charged against assets in determinations of financial condition; specifies reserves certain title insurers must set aside after certain date; specifies manner in which reserves must be released; specifies which state law governs amount of reserve for title insurer who transfers domicile to this state; provides that domestic title insurer is not required to record separate bulk reserves; requires domestic title insurers to obtain approval from OIR before using or recording bulk reserve; revises & providing definitions. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 531 by Richardson (Similar SB 640)

Public Health Trusts; Authorizes public health trusts to lease certain real property. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Read second time April 21

CS/CS/SB 590 by Criminal Justice, Banking and Insurance, Richter (Similar CS/HB 623)

Money Services Businesses; Providing that failing to provide certain information relating to a check cashing transaction is a felony; authorizing the Office of Financial Regulation to summarily suspend a license if criminal charges are filed against certain persons or such persons are arrested for certain offenses; providing that a deferred presentment transaction conducted by an unauthorized person is void, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

CS/HB 7077 by Health & Human Services Committee, Health Quality Subcommittee, Patronis, Saunders (Similar CS/SB 662)

Nonresident Sterile Compounding Permits; Expands penalties to apply to injury to nonhuman animal; deletes requirement that Board of Pharmacy refer regulatory issues affecting nonresident pharmacy to state where pharmacy is located; provides that pharmacy is subject to certain health care fraud provisions; requires registered nonresident pharmacies & outsourcing facilities to obtain permit in order to ship, mail, deliver, or dispense compounded sterile products into this state; authorizes board to deny, revoke, or suspend permit, or impose fine or reprimand for certain actions; provides dates by which certain nonresident pharmacies must obtain permit; authorizes board to adopt rules; authorizes department to inspect nonresident pharmacies & nonresident sterile compounding permittees; requires such pharmacies & permittees to pay for costs of such inspections. Effective Date: October 1, 2014

Nicotine Dispensing Devices; Prohibiting the gift of sample nicotine dispensing devices to persons under 18 years of age; prohibiting the selling, delivering, bartering, furnishing, or giving of nicotine dispensing devices to persons under 18 years of age, to which penalties apply; prohibiting persons under 18 years of age from possessing, purchasing, or misrepresenting their age or military service to purchase nicotine dispensing devices; requiring certain signage where a dealer sells nicotine dispensing devices, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

Tobacco and Nicotine Product Regulation; Preempts regulation of sale of tobacco products, nicotine products, and nicotine dispensing devices to state; prohibits selling, delivering, bartering, furnishing, or giving of nicotine products or nicotine dispensing devices to persons under 18 years of age; prohibits gift of sample nicotine products or nicotine dispensing devices to persons under 18 years of age; provides affirmative defenses for person charged with certain violations; prohibits person under 18 years of age from possessing, purchasing, or misrepresenting his or her age or military service to purchase nicotine products or nicotine dispensing devices; provides for use of civil fines; requires certain signage at retail locations; prohibits sale or delivery of nicotine products or nicotine dispensing devices except when such products are under direct control or line of sight of retailer; prohibits sales from vending machine unless it is equipped with certain devices. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Florida Teachers Classroom Supply Assistance Program; Revises procedures for distributing program funds to classroom teachers. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

K-12 Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Appropriations Committee: Favorable; Education Committee: Favorable

CS/HB 211 by Health Quality Subcommittee, Reed (Identical CS/SB 306)

Community Health Workers; Specifies duties & activities of community health workers; creates Community Health Worker Task Force within Florida College System institution or state university; requires DOH to provide administrative support & services; provides membership & duties of task force; requires members of task force to elect chair & vice chair; provides that task force members serve without compensation & are not entitled to reimbursement for per diem or travel expenses; requires that task force meet at least quarterly; authorizes task force members to meet in person or by teleconference or other electronic means; specifies number of members required for quorum; requires task force to submit report to Governor & Legislature by specified date; provides for future repeal of task force. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Health Quality Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Health & Human Services Committee: Favorable

CS/CS/HB 631 by Regulatory Affairs Committee, Insurance & Banking Subcommittee, Workman (Similar SB 666)

Loan Originators, Mortgage Brokers, & Mortgage Lenders; Authorizes OFR to conduct joint or concurrent examination of licensees; provides that violating specified rules is grounds for disciplinary action; provides for change in license status if specified licensees fail to meet certain requirements for annual license renewal by specified dates; provides guidelines for license renewal; deletes certain requirements regarding specified fees; deletes certain notice requirements; authorizes FSC to prescribe time period by which mortgage brokers & lenders must file report of condition; deletes certain disclosure & notice requirements; revises period during which mortgage lender may service loans in its own name; repeals provisions relating to arbitration, required disclosures by mortgage brokers receiving certain fees; repeals Florida Fair Lending Act & provisions relating to conditions for mortgage loans of specified amounts secured by vacant land. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Insurance & Banking Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Government Operations Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable; Regulatory Affairs Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

CS/CS/HB 3 by Transportation & Economic Development Appropriations Subcommittee, Transportation & Highway Safety Subcommittee, Ray, Baxley, Bracy, Broxson, Moraitis, Van Zant (Compare CS/SB 136)

Freight and Trade; Revises provisions related to funding for seaport asset management plans and State Transportation Trust Fund for Intermodal Logistics Center Infrastructure Support Program; authorizes county or two or more contiguous counties to designate certain areas as freight logistics zone; provides that certain projects within freight logistics zones may be eligible for priority in state funding & certain incentive programs; provides evaluation criteria for freight logistics zones; requires certain entities to conduct review of continuity of operations plans and consistent asset management plans and authorizes such entities to develop all-hazards economic recovery plan & resumption of trade plan; revises provisions providing that certain public roads may be designated as port district roads; requires DOT to designate such roads with appropriate signage. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Transportation & Highway Safety Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Transportation & Economic Development Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Economic Affairs Committee: Favorable

CS/HB 485 by Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Raburn, Albritton, Diaz, M., Eagle, Hutson, Raulerson, Spano (Similar CS/SB 698)

Sexual Offenses Against Students by Authority Figures; Designates act the "Stop Harassing Underage Teens Act"; provides for reclassification of specified sexual offenses committed against students by authority figure of school; provides for severity ranking of offenses. Effective Date: October 1, 2014
