

**CS/SB 1190 by Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Lee** (Similar CS/HB 1397)

**Family Law;** Creating the "Collaborative Law Act"; declaring that a collaborative law process commences when the parties enter into a collaborative law participation agreement; providing that a tribunal may not order a party to participate in a collaborative law process over the party's objection; providing for confidentiality of communications made during the collaborative law process, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2014

**Motorist Safety;** Authorizes governing body of county to create yellow dot critical motorist medical information program for certain purposes; provides for limited use of information by emergency medical responders. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Transportation & Highway Safety Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Local & Federal Affairs Committee: Favorable; Economic Affairs Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

CS/CS/HB 19 by Government Operations Subcommittee, Transportation & Highway Safety Subcommittee, Slosberg, Campbell, Rangel (Similar CS/CS/SB 350, Compare CS/SB 262)

**Pub. Rec./Yellow Dot Critical Motorist Medical Information Program;** Provides exemption from public records requirements for specified identifying information, medical records, & medical information of participants in yellow dot critical motorist medical information program. Effective Date: on the same date that HB 17 or similar legislation authorizing the governing body of a county to create a yellow dot critical motorist medical information program takes effect

Transportation & Highway Safety Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Government Operations Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Economic Affairs Committee: Favorable CS/CS/HB 27 by Health & Human Services Committee, Health Innovation Subcommittee, Diaz, J., Campbell, Coley, Fresen, Hager, Harrell, Hood, Rooney (Similar CS/SB 340)

Statewide Prepaid Dental Program; Creates Medicaid statewide prepaid dental program; directs AHCA to contract with prepaid dental health plans meeting specified criteria; directs agency to apply for & implement state plan amendments or waivers of applicable federal laws & regulations necessary to implement program; directs agency to procure licensed prepaid dental health plans; prohibiting the agency from extending certain contracts; provides that enrollment is contingent upon implementation of state plan amendments or federal waivers; provides for eligible children to receive dental services through Medicaid managed medical assistance program until plan is implemented; requires notice to recipients regarding transition from Medicaid managed medical assistance program to statewide program; requires agency to submit an annual report to Governor & Legislature; removes requirement that managed care plans participating in Medicaid managed assistance program provide pediatric dental services. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

**CS/HB 73 by Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Edwards, Eagle, Adkins, Ahern, Albritton, Baxley, Cummings, Harrell, Hood, Mayfield, Moskowitz, Perry, Pilon, Richardson, Rogers, Smith, Spano, Stewart, Torres, Van Zant** (Compare CS/HB 7027, CS/SB 182, CS/CS/CS/SB 526)

**Sexual Offenders;** Prohibits certain conditional releasees, probationers, or community controllees from viewing, accessing, owning, or possessing any obscene, pornographic, or sexually stimulating material, regardless of such material's relevance to offender's deviant behavior pattern. Effective Date: October 1, 2014

Criminal Justice Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Justice Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable; Judiciary Committee: Favorable CS/HB 105 by Civil Justice Subcommittee, Berman, Campbell, Clarke-Reed, Edwards, Kerner, Moskowitz, Murphy, Pafford, Rangel, Rehwinkel Vasilinda, Saunders, Schwartz, Stafford, Stark, Torres, Watson, B., Watson, C. (Identical CS/SB 220)

**Florida Civil Rights Act;** Prohibits discrimination on basis of pregnancy in specified establishments; prohibits employment discrimination on basis of pregnancy, childbirth, or related medical conditions; prohibits discrimination on basis of pregnancy by labor organizations, joint labor-management committees, employment agencies, or in licensing. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Civil Justice Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; State Affairs Committee: Favorable; Judiciary Committee: Favorable

CS/HB 113 by Education Committee, Fresen, Campbell, Diaz, M., Gibbons, Gonzalez, Raschein, Rodríguez, J., Watson, B. (Similar CS/SB 66)

Discretionary Sales Surtaxes; Authorizes county to levy surtax up to specified amount for benefit of Florida College System institution & state university in county pursuant to ordinance conditioned to take effect upon approval in referendum; requires ordinance to include plan for use of proceeds; provides referendum requirements & procedures; requires that proceeds from surtax be transferred into specified account & managed in specified manner; establishes oversight board with specified duties, responsibilities, & requirements relating to expenditure of surtax proceeds; provides for appointment of members of oversight board; requires that board of trustees of each institution receiving surtax proceeds prepare annual plan for submission to oversight board for approval; provides that state funding may not be reduced because institution receives surtax funds; provides for scheduled expiration of surtax. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

CS/CS/HB 143 by Regulatory Affairs Committee, Insurance & Banking Subcommittee, Raburn, Campbell, Combee, Gibbons (Similar CS/SB 346, Compare CS/CS/SB 870)

Florida Insurance Guaranty Association; Defines "assessment year"; revises provisions relating to levy of assessments on insurers; specifies conditions under which such assessments are paid; revises procedures & timeframes for levy of assessments; revises exemption for assessments; requires charges or recoupments to be displayed separately on premium bills to policyholders & prohibits their inclusion in rates. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Insurance & Banking Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Finance & Tax Subcommittee: Favorable; Regulatory Affairs Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute **CS/HB 155** by Economic Development & Tourism Subcommittee, Smith, Albritton, Eagle, Gaetz, Van Zant (Similar CS/SB 596)

**Defense Contracting;** Establishes Defense Works in Florida Incentive; provides that certain prime contractors may apply to DEO to certify that such contractors may reduce their computation of adjusted federal income by certain amount when awarded prime contract; provides requirements to apply for reduction in computation of income; provides that prime contractor must apply separately for each qualified subcontract award; provides guidelines for DEO to certify an award; provides rulemaking authority; revises definition of "adjusted federal income" for corporate income tax purposes, to conform. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Economic Development & Tourism Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Finance & Tax Subcommittee: Favorable; Economic Affairs Committee: Favorable

## HB 161 by Hager, Harrell, Mayfield, Moskowitz, Spano, Van Zant (Identical SB 254, Compare HB 181, SB 276)

**Indecent Exposure;** Increases classification of second & subsequent violations of provision prohibiting unlawful exposure of sexual organs; authorizes arrest without warrant if there is probable cause to believe that person has committed unlawful exposure of sexual organs in violation of specified provisions. Effective Date: October 1, 2014

Criminal Justice Subcommittee: Favorable; Justice Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable; Judiciary Committee: Favorable

CS/CS/CS/HB 185 by Regulatory Affairs Committee, Agriculture & Natural Resources Appropriations Subcommittee, Business & Professional Regulation Subcommittee, Danish, Dudley, Stark (Similar CS/CS/SB 1184, Compare CS/CS/HB 7005, CS/CS/SB 1272)

**Gasoline Stations;** Requires self-service gasoline pumps to display additional decal containing specified information; requires DOACS to confirm compliance by specified date; provides for preemption of local laws & regulations pertaining to fueling assistance for certain motor vehicle operators; provides that retail outlet is not required to provide air or vacuum supply without charge; preempts to state power to regulate & set pricing of such commodities. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Business & Professional Regulation Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Agriculture & Natural Resources Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Regulatory Affairs Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

**CS/HB 215 by Ethics & Elections Subcommittee, Broxson, Ahern, Nuñez, Watson, C.** (Identical SB 486)

**Federal Write-in Absentee Ballot;** Authorizes absent uniformed services voters & overseas voters to use federal write-in absentee ballot in any state or local election; provides that eligible elector may vote on any ballot measure in election using federal write-in absentee ballot; specifies that vote cast in judicial merit retention election be treated in same manner as vote on certain ballot measures; revises minimum requirements for DOS rules used in determining what constitutes valid vote on federal write-in absentee ballot. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

CS/CS/SB 248 by Appropriations, Health Policy, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs (Compare CS/HB 91, HB 263, CS/CS/CS/HB 573, SB 186, CS/SB 508, CS/CS/SB 782)

Assisted Living Facilities; Providing that Medicaid managed care plans are responsible for enrolled mental health residents; providing that managing entities under contract with the Department of Children and Families are responsible for mental health residents who are not enrolled with a Medicaid managed care plan; revising the requirement that an extended congregate care license be issued to certain facilities that have been licensed as assisted living facilities under certain circumstances and authorizing the issuance of such license if a specified condition is met, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2014

**Public School Instruction;** Requires that instructional staff of public schools provide instruction to students about terrorist attacks occurring on September 11, 2001, & impact of those events. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

K-12 Subcommittee: Favorable; Education Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable; Education Committee: Favorable

**CS/HB 295** by Government Operations Subcommittee, Porter (Compare SB 560)

**Employment after Retirement of School District Personnel;** Revises provisions relating to reemployment of retirees as instructional personnel on contract basis; provides legislative intent & findings to clarify authorization to award contracts; provides requirements for judgment in certain civil actions or administrative proceedings. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Government Operations Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Appropriations Committee: Favorable

### CS/HB 347 by Regulatory Affairs Committee, Clarke-Reed, Campbell, Edwards, Pafford, Rangel, Reed, Rogers, Rooney, Saunders, Torres, Van Zant (Similar SB 320)

**Commercial and Recreational Water Activities;** Designates act as "White-Miskell Act"; provides requirements and prohibitions for parasailing, kite boarding, kite surfing, and moored ballooning. Effective Date: October 1, 2014

Business & Professional Regulation Subcommittee: Favorable; Agriculture & Natural Resources Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable; Regulatory Affairs Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

#### **CS/CS/HB 387 by Regulatory Affairs Committee, Business & Professional Regulation Subcommittee, Passidomo** (Similar CS/SB 470, Compare HB 7075, CS/SB 406)

Malt Beverage Tastings; Removes prohibition on beer samplings at premises of vendors licensed for off-premises sales only; authorizes malt beverage tastings on licensed premises of certain vendors, subject to certain requirements, limitations, liabilities, & penalties; provides construction with respect to special acts & ordinances; revises prohibition on cooperative advertising with vendor & prohibiting certain persons from naming vendors in advertising for malt beverage tasting. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Business & Professional Regulation Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Regulatory Affairs Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

**CS/CS/HB 391** by Government Operations Appropriations Subcommittee, Insurance & Banking Subcommittee, Hager, Lee (Identical CS/SB 482)

**Florida Catastrophic Storm Risk Management Center;** Transfers portion of investment income of Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund to Florida Catastrophic Storm Risk Management Center to support center's ongoing operations. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Insurance & Banking Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Government Operations Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Regulatory Affairs Committee: Favorable

## **CS/CS/HB 429 by Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Civil Justice Subcommittee, Passidomo, Young, Boyd** (Compare CS/CS/SB 764)

**Hearsay;** Provides that certain statements regarding an act of domestic violence are an exception to hearsay rule & thus admissible at court hearing or trial. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Civil Justice Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Criminal Justice Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Judiciary Committee: Favorable

### CS/CS/HB 445 by Judiciary Committee, Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Nuñez, Ahern, Berman, Campbell, Mayfield, Pafford, Rehwinkel Vasilinda (Similar CS/SB 494, Compare CS/HB 7027, CS/CS/CS/SB 526)

**Time Limitations;** Eliminates statutes of limitations on commencement of civil or criminal actions relating to specified lewd & lascivious offenses if victim was under 16 at time of offense; provides an exception; provides applicability. Effective Date: October 1, 2014

Criminal Justice Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Justice Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable; Judiciary Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

#### **CS/HB 455 by Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Eagle, Artiles** (Similar SB 1040)

**Restitution for Juvenile Offenses;** Requires child's parent or guardian, in addition to child, to make restitution for damage or loss caused by child's offense; provides for payment plans in certain circumstances; authorizes parent or guardian to be absolved of liability for restitution in certain circumstances; authorizes court to order both parents or guardians liable for child's restitution regardless of one parent having sole parental responsibility; specifies that DCF, foster parents, & specified agencies contracting with DCF are not guardians for purposes of restitution; removes duplicative provisions authorizing court to require parent or guardian to be responsible for any restitution ordered against child. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

**CS/HB 469 by Transportation & Highway Safety Subcommittee, Raschein** (Similar SB 478, Compare CS/CS/HB 7005)

**Move Over Act;** Requires driver to move over when approaching sanitation or utility service vehicle performing service-related task on roadside. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Transportation & Highway Safety Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Economic Affairs Committee: Favorable **CS/HB 491** by Health Quality Subcommittee, Pafford, Gonzalez, Campbell, Pigman, Rader, Richardson, Rodríguez, J., Rooney, Saunders, Waldman, Watson, C., Williams, A. (Similar CS/SB 408)

**Infectious Disease Elimination Pilot Program;** Designates act as "Miami-Dade Infectious Disease Elimination Act (IDEA)"; requires DOH to establish pilot program in Miami-Dade County; provides for administration by DOH or designee; provides that distribution of needles & syringes under pilot program does not violate Florida Comprehensive Drug Abuse Prevention & Control Act or any other law; provides conditions under which pilot program staff member or participant may be prosecuted; requires report by OPPAGA. Effective Date: July 1, 2014

Health Quality Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Government Operations Subcommittee: Favorable; Judiciary Committee: Favorable; Health & Human Services Committee: Favorable
