#### BILLS AND JOINT RESOLUTIONS ON SECOND READING

The Following Bills are now available for Amendment.

HJR 53 by Tant (Identical SJR 618, Compare CS/SB 616)

Ad Valorem Property Tax Exemption for the Surviving Spouse of Quadriplegics; Proposes amendment to State Constitution to authorize Legislature to provide for property tax exemption for surviving spouse of quadriplegic who was receiving property tax exemption on real estate used & owned as homestead at time of their death.

Ways & Means Committee: Favorable; Local Administration, Federal Affairs & Special Districts Subcommittee: Favorable; State Affairs Committee: Favorable

**HB 55 by Tant, Bartleman, Woodson** (Identical CS/SB 616, Compare SJR 618)

Tax Exemptions for Surviving Spouses of Quadriplegics;

Authorizes surviving spouses of certain quadriplegics to carry over certain tax exemption in certain circumstances. Effective Date: on the effective date of the amendment to the State Constitution proposed by HJR 53, or a similar joint resolution having substantially the same specific intent and purpose

**HB 63 by Woodson, Bartleman, Eskamani, Garcia, Tant** (Identical SB 410)

**Protection from Surgical Smoke;** Requiring hospitals & ambulatory surgical centers to adopt & implement policies requiring use of smoke evacuation systems during certain surgical procedures. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Select Committee on Health Innovation: Favorable; Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable; Health & Human Services Committee: Favorable

CS/HB 75 by Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Rizo, Benjamin, Fabricio, Garcia, Yarkosky (Similar SB 184)

**Impeding, Threatening, or Harassing First Responders;** Specifies that peaceful recording, photographing, or observation is not harassment; prohibits approaching first responder or remaining within specified distance of such person with intent to impede, threaten, or harass person from performing lawful duties after receiving warning not to approach. Effective Date: October 1, 2024

Criminal Justice Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Judiciary Committee: Favorable

**CS/HB 81 by Commerce Committee, Brackett** (Similar CS/SB 366)

**Civil Penalties under the Gas Safety Law of 1967;** Increases civil penalty amount for violating the Gas Safety Law of 1967; requires PSC to annually revise maximum penalties by rule based on specified factors. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Energy, Communications & Cybersecurity Subcommittee: Favorable; Commerce Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute **CS/HB 85 by Insurance & Banking Subcommittee, Barnaby** (Similar CS/SB 1014)

Pub. Rec./New State Banks and New State Trust Companies;

Provides exemption from public records requirements for information received by OFR relating to application for authority to organize new state bank or new state trust company until specified conditions are met; provides for future legislative review & repeal of exemptions; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Insurance & Banking Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Ethics, Elections & Open Government Subcommittee: Favorable; Commerce Committee: Favorable

#### **CS/HB 87 by Infrastructure Strategies Committee, Shoaf**, **Andrade, Black, Rudman, Salzman, Tant** (Similar CS/CS/SB 632)

**Taking of Bears;** Provides exemption from penalties for taking of bears without permits or authorizations under specified conditions; requires disposal of such bears by FWCC; prohibits certain possession, sale, & disposal of such bears; requires FWCC to adopt rules. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Agriculture, Conservation & Resiliency Subcommittee: Favorable; Agriculture & Natural Resources Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable; Infrastructure Strategies Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

**CS/HB 89 by Healthcare Regulation Subcommittee, Plakon, Tant** (Identical CS/CS/SB 66)

**Revive Awareness Day;** Designates June 6 of each year as "Revive Awareness Day"; authorizes the Governor to issue an annual proclamation; encourages DOH to hold events to raise awareness of the dangers of opioid overdose and the availability and safe use of opioid antagonists as an effective way to rapidly reverse the effects of opioid overdose. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

## HB 91 by Clemons, Mooney, Black, LaMarca, Skidmore (Identical CS/SB 84)

**Transportation Facility Designations;** Designates Jimmy Buffett Memorial Highway in specified counties. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Transportation & Modals Subcommittee: Favorable; Infrastructure & Tourism Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable; Infrastructure Strategies Committee: Favorable **CS/HB 95 by Regulatory Reform & Economic Development Subcommittee, LaMarca** (Similar SB 92)

Yacht and Ship Brokers' Act; Revises definition of term "yacht"; exempts person who conducts business as broker or salesperson in another state from licensure in this state for specified transactions; requires Division of Florida Condominiums, Timeshares, & Mobile Homes of DBPR to deny licenses for applicants who fail to meet certain requirements; revises requirements for licensure as broker. Effective Date: October 1, 2024

**CS/HB 99 by Healthcare Regulation Subcommittee**, **Hunschofsky, Benjamin, Campbell, Garcia, Harris, Tant, Woodson** (Similar SB 68, Compare CS/HB 1549, SB 70)

**Social Work Licensure Interstate Compact;** Creates Social Work Licensure Interstate Compact; provides for recognition of access to social work services, including through telehealth, in member states; provides for development of data system, reporting procedures, & exchange of specified information between member states; specifies licensees practicing in remote state under compact must adhere to laws & rules of that state. Effective Date: upon enactment of the Social Work Licensure Interstate Compact into law by seven states

**CS/HB 103 by Civil Justice Subcommittee**, Arrington, López, J. (Identical CS/SB 712)

**Pub. Rec./County and City Attorneys;** Provides exemption from public records requirements for personal identifying & location information of current county attorneys, assistant county attorneys, deputy county attorneys, city attorneys, assistant city attorneys, & deputy city attorneys & names & personal identifying & location information of spouses & children of such attorneys; provides for future legislative review & repeal; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Civil Justice Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Ethics, Elections & Open Government Subcommittee: Favorable; Judiciary Committee: Favorable

HB 113 by Maney, Salzman, Tant, Valdés (Identical SB 216)

**Tax Collections and Sales;** Removes specified processing fee; revises information to be included in certain report; revises calculation of interest for canceled tax deed applications. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Ways & Means Committee: Favorable; Local Administration, Federal Affairs & Special Districts Subcommittee: Favorable; State Affairs Committee: Favorable CS/HB 115 by Healthcare Regulation Subcommittee, Bankson, Plakon, Abbott, Amesty, Antone, Arrington, Bartleman, Garcia, Hunschofsky, Jacques, Killebrew, López, J., Plasencia, Porras, Smith, Stark, Tant, Yarkosky (Similar CS/SB 186)

**Progressive Supranuclear Palsy and Other Neurodegenerative Diseases Policy Workgroup;** Requires State Surgeon General to establish progressive supranuclear palsy & other neurodegenerative diseases policy workgroup; provides for duties, membership, & meetings of workgroup; requiring State Surgeon General to submit annual reports & final report by specified date to Governor & Legislature. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

#### CS/HB 117 by Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Gossett-Seidman, Stark (Identical CS/CS/SB 234)

**Disclosure of Grand Jury Testimony;** Revises list of persons prohibited from disclosing testimony of witness examined before grand jury or evidence it receives; creates exception for request by media or interested person. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Criminal Justice Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Ethics, Elections & Open Government Subcommittee: Favorable; Judiciary Committee: Favorable

#### **CS/HB 133** by Commerce Committee, Chambliss, Plakon, Hunschofsky, Mooney, Tramont (Similar SB 42)

**Criminal History of Licensees and Employees;** Provides period of time when convictions, or any other adjudication, for crimes may not be grounds for denial of licensure as barber or cosmetologist; providing exception; requires applicable board to approve certain educational program credits; repeals provision prohibiting employment of certain individuals by licensed vendor. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Regulatory Reform & Economic Development Subcommittee: Favorable; Commerce Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

**CS/HM 143 by Transportation & Modals Subcommittee, Sirois, Bankson** (Similar SM 370)

**Tax-exempt Private Activity Bonds;** Urges Congress to add spaceports as qualified tax-exempt category of private activity bonds.

Transportation & Modals Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Ways & Means Committee: Favorable; Infrastructure Strategies Committee: Favorable

### **CS/HB 175 by Civil Justice Subcommittee**, **Benjamin** (Similar CS/SB 984)

**Judgment Liens;** Authorizes judgment lien to attach to specified personal property & all payment intangibles & accounts of judgment debtor in this state; specifies that filing of noncompliant judgment lien certificate does not preclude subsequent filing of compliant judgment lien certificate; specifies provisions to be used in resolving priority of conflicting rights between judgment lienholder & secured party; specifies that rights of certain judgment debtors to proceed against judgment debtor's property are subject to certain provisions; provides that an account debtor may discharge certain obligations through settlement agreement. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

#### HB 191 by Brackett

**Town of Orchid, Indian River County;** Provides exception to general law; authorizes the Town of Orchid in Indian River County to hold public meetings within specified mileage of its jurisdictional boundary under certain circumstances. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Local Administration, Federal Affairs & Special Districts Subcommittee: Favorable; Ethics, Elections & Open Government Subcommittee: Favorable; State Affairs Committee: Favorable

**CS/CS/HB 197** by Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee, Healthcare Regulation Subcommittee, Lopez, V., Bartleman, Edmonds, Garcia, Melo, Overdorf, Steele, Woodson (Similar SB 896)

Health Care Practitioners and Massage Therapy; Requires DOH to report specified data; authorizes DOH to suspend license of certain health care practitioners & massage establishments in certain circumstances; revises advertising requirements for massage therapists & massage establishments; prohibits establishments from sheltering or harboring, or being used as sleeping quarters for any person; requires DOH investigators to request government identification from all employees while in massage establishment; specifies additional documents person operating massage establishment must present, upon request, to DOH investigators & law enforcement officers; requires DOH to notify federal immigration office if specified persons fail to provide government identification; revises definition of "unlicensed massage establishment". Effective Date: July 1, 2024

CS/HB 201 by Healthcare Regulation Subcommittee, Bell, Berfield, Harris, Tant (Identical CS/SB 516)

**Emergency Refills of Insulin and Insulin-related Supplies or Equipment;** Authorizes emergency refill of insulin & insulin-related supplies or equipment a specified number of times per year. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Healthcare Regulation Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Health & Human Services Committee: Favorable

#### **CS/HB 215 by Insurance & Banking Subcommittee, Truenow** (Similar CS/SB 846)

**Risk Retention Groups;** Provides that motor vehicle insurance coverage issued by risk retention groups operating under federal law satisfies financial responsibility requirements under state motor vehicle law. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Insurance & Banking Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Commerce Committee: Favorable

#### **CS/HB 227 by Healthcare Regulation Subcommittee, Garcia, Benjamin** (Similar SB 672)
