Effective Date: Except as otherwise provided herein, this act shall take effect July 1, 2024, or upon becoming law, whichever occurs later; however, if this act becomes law after July 1, 2024, then it shall operate retroactively to July 1, 2024.

Property Seized by the Florida Gaming Control Commission; Provides certain property seized by the Florida Gaming Control Commission shall be deposited into Florida Gaming Control Commission Pari-Mutuel Wagering Trust Fund. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Florida Retirement System; Revising provisions related to FRS, including elected officials in DROP, reemployment after retirement, Florida Retirement System Preservation of Benefits Plan membership, cost-of-living adjustments, employee contributions, and allocations to investment plan accounts. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Constitutional Rights, Rule of Law & Government Operations Subcommittee: Favorable; Appropriations Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

HB 5301 by Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee, Garrison (Compare HB 5001, SB 2500)

Medicaid Supplemental Payment Programs; Provides requirements for hospital participation in certain Medicaid supplemental payment programs. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 5401 by Justice Appropriations Subcommittee, Brannan (Similar SB 2514, Compare HB 5001, SB 2500)

Judges; Revises number of circuit court judges & county court judges. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 83 by Lopez, V., Garcia (Identical SB 520, Compare HB 5001, SB 2500)

Trust Funds/Re-creation/State-Operated Institutions Inmate Welfare Trust Fund/DOC; Re-creates State-Operated Institutions Inmate Welfare Trust Fund within DOC; abrogates provisions relating to termination. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

B. PROCEDURES:

Time allocations apply to all bills listed in Section A and any bill substituted for or taken up in lieu of a listed bill. Amendment sponsors shall have 2 minutes to open and 2 minutes to close, except as outlined below.

Except for the bills listed in Section C, the House shall spend no more than the following times:

- For each bill:
 - Questions and answers - 10 minutes
 - Debate - 5 minutes
- For each amendment:
 - Questions and answers - 5 minutes
 - Debate - 5 minutes

For all bills, along with their associated amendments, the time for questions and answers includes both the question and the answer and shall be no more than the times listed. Neither the question nor the answer shall be protracted in an attempt to use up the time.

Once more than 10 non-bill sponsor amendments are filed, the allocation of time spent on each non-bill sponsor amendment shall be determined as follows:

- 90 minutes divided by the total number of non-sponsor amendments filed.
- The time allocated for each non-bill sponsor amendment shall be divided equally between the open, questions, debate, and close.
- Amendments withdrawn prior to consideration of the bill don't count toward the total.

For the bills listed in Section C, time spent on debate shall be allocated as specified, with the time equally divided. In addition to the allotted time, the sponsor will explain and close the bill, closing not to exceed 10 minutes. After opening, the debate managers identified below (or their designee) shall be alternately recognized until their time runs out. Time not utilized is lost.

- Debate managers may speak in debate and yield time to other Members to debate; no Member may be recognized for debate unless a debate manager yields time to that Member. Recognitions of debate managers must go through the Speaker. A Member may not be recognized more than once in debate on the bill or amendment.

HJR 53 by Tant (Identical SJR 618, Compare CS/SB 616)

Ad Valorem Property Tax Exemption for the Surviving Spouse of Quadriplegics; Proposes amendment to State Constitution to authorize Legislature to provide for property tax exemption for surviving spouse of quadriplegic who was receiving property tax exemption on real estate used & owned as homestead at time of their death.

HB 55 by Tant, Bartleman, Woodson (Identical CS/SB 616, Compare SJR 618)

Effective Date: on the effective date of the amendment to the State Constitution proposed by HJR 53, or a similar joint resolution having substantially the same specific intent and purpose

Impeding, Threatening, or Harassing First Responders; Specifies that peaceful recording, photographing, or observation is not harassment; prohibits approaching first responder or remaining within specified distance of such person with intent to impede, threaten, or harass person from performing lawful duties after receiving warning not to approach. Effective Date: October 1, 2024

Criminal Justice Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Judiciary Committee: Favorable

CS/HB 81 by Commerce Committee, Brackett (Similar CS/SB 366)

Civil Penalties under the Gas Safety Law of 1967; Increases civil penalty amount for violating the Gas Safety Law of 1967; requires PSC to annually revise maximum penalties by rule based on specified factors. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Energy, Communications & Cybersecurity Subcommittee: Favorable; Commerce Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

CS/HB 85 by Insurance & Banking Subcommittee, Barnaby (Similar SB 1014)

Pub. Rec./New State Banks and New State Trust Companies; Provides exemption from public records requirements for information received by OFR relating to application for authority to organize new state bank or new state trust company until specified conditions are met; provides for future legislative review & repeal of exemptions; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Insurance & Banking Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Ethics, Elections & Open Government Subcommittee: Favorable; Commerce Committee: Favorable

CS/HB 87 by Infrastructure Strategies Committee, Shoaf, Andrade, Black, Rudman, Salzman, Tant (Similar CS/SB 632)

Taking of Bears; Provides exemption from penalties for taking of bears without permits or authorizations under specified conditions; requires disposal of such bears by FWCC; prohibits certain possession, sale, & disposal of such bears; requires FWCC to adopt rules. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Agriculture, Conservation & Resiliency Subcommittee: Favorable; Agriculture & Natural Resources Appropriations Subcommittee: Favorable; Infrastructure Strategies Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

CS/HB 103 by Civil Justice Subcommittee, Arrington, López, J. (Identical CS/SB 712)

Pub. Rec./County and City Attorneys; Provides exemption from public records requirements for personal identifying & location information of current county attorneys, assistant county attorneys, deputy county attorneys, city attorneys, assistant city attorneys, & deputy city attorneys & names & personal identifying & location information of spouses & children of such attorneys; provides for future legislative review & repeal; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Civil Justice Subcommittee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Ethics, Elections & Open Government Subcommittee: Favorable; Judiciary Committee: Favorable
