Motor Vehicle Racing Penalties; Increases fine for specified offenses; increases criminal penalty & revising applicability of criminal penalty for second offenses of specified violations occurring within specified time period; provides penalties for impeding, obstructing, or interfering with an emergency vehicle while participating in drag race, street takeover, stunt driving, competition, contest, test, or exhibition; increases penalty for third or subsequent offenses of specified violations occurring within specified time period; increases fine for such violations; increases fine for acting as spectator at specified violations. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

CS/CS/HB 7021 by Health & Human Services Committee, Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee, Children, Families & Seniors Subcommittee, Maney, Basabe, Silvers, Stark (Similar CS/SB 1784, Compare CS/HB 915, SB 1626)

Mental Health and Substance Abuse; Revises written notice requirements relating to filing petitions for involuntary services; revises requirements relating to voluntary admissions to facility for examination & treatment, ordering person for involuntary services & treatment, petitions for involuntary service, appointment of counsel, & continuances of hearings; revises actions that constitute unlawful activities relating to assessment & treatment & court actions relating to involuntary assessments. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Read second time and amended March 1

CS/HB 7023 by Health & Human Services Committee, Children, Families & Seniors Subcommittee, Maney, Basabe, Silvers, Stark (Compare CS/SB 1784)

Pub. Rec. and Meetings/Mental Health and Substance Abuse; Specifies all hearings relating to mental health & substance abuse, respectively, are confidential & closed to public; provides exceptions; expands public records exemption to include certain petitions & applications; revises date for future legislative review & repeal; provides public necessity statements. Effective Date: on the same date that HB 7021 or similar legislation takes effect

Read second time March 1

HB 7089 by Health & Human Services Committee, Grant (Similar SB 1502, CS/SB 1640)

Health Care Expenses; Establishes 3-year statute of limitations for action to collect medical debt for services; provides personal property exemptions from legal process for medical debts; requires licensed facility to post on its website consumer-friendly list of standard charges; requires licensed facility to provide estimate to patient & patient's insurer; requires licensed facility to establish internal grievance process for patients to dispute charges; prohibits collection activities by licensed facility; requires health insurer to provide insured with advanced explanation of benefits for scheduled services; provides shared savings incentive offered by health insurer or HMO constitutes medical expense for rate development & rate filing purposes. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

CS/HB 227 by Healthcare Regulation Subcommittee, Garcia, Benjamin (Similar SB 672)

Intravenous Vitamin Treatment; Provides requirements for persons administering intravenous vitamin treatment; requires Board of Nursing, Board of Medicine & Board of Osteopathic Medicine to adopt rules establishing procedures to administer intravenous vitamin treatment & emergency protocols; provides exemption for certain licensed facilities. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Read second time March 1

CS/HB 865 by Healthcare Regulation Subcommittee, Yeager, Bell, Daniels, Eskamani, Gonzalez Pittman, Stark, Valdés (Compare HB 1479, CS/CS/SB 830, SB 1776)

Youth Athletic Activities; Revises requirements for athletic coaches to include certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation, first aid, & use of automatic external defibrillators. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

CS/CS/HB 1319 by Appropriations Committee, Postsecondary Education & Workforce Subcommittee, Tuck (Similar SB 1476)

Trust Funds/Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences Relocation and Reconstruction Trust Fund; Creates Institute of Food & Agricultural Sciences Renovation, Relocation, & Construction Trust Fund for specified purposes; authorizes Board of Trustees of Internal Improvement Trust Fund, at request of University of Florida Board of Trustees, to sell, trade, exchange, or otherwise dispose of specified real property & improvements; requires such funds to be deposited into trust fund for specified purposes; authorizes Board of Trustees of Internal Improvement Trust Fund, at request of University of Florida Board of Trustees, to purchase real property or improvements for specified facilities. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Read second time March 1

CS/CS/SB 770 by Fiscal Policy, Community Affairs, Martin (Similar CS/CS/CS/HB 927)

Improvements to Real Property; Authorizing a program administrator to offer a program for financing qualifying improvements for residential property when authorized by a county or municipality; authorizing a program administrator to levy non-ad valorem assessments for a certain purpose; providing for compensation for tax collectors for actual costs incurred to collect non-ad valorem assessments; requiring certain financing agreement and contract provisions for change orders under certain circumstances; requiring a county or municipality to establish or approve a process for the registration of a qualifying improvement contractor to install qualifying improvements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time and amended March 1

HB 1451 by Michael, Jacques, Holcomb (Identical SB 1174)

Identification Documents; Prohibits counties & municipalities, respectively, from accepting certain ID cards or documents that are knowingly issued to individuals who are not lawfully present in United States as form of identification; provides exception. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Read second time March 1

CS/CS/HB 1567 by State Affairs Committee, Constitutional Rights, Rule of Law & Government Operations Subcommittee, Grant, Roth (Similar CS/CS/SB 1262)

Qualifications for County Emergency Management Directors; Requiring county emergency management directors to meet specified qualifications; requiring current such directors to meet such qualifications by specified date. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Read second time and amended March 1

CS/CS/HB 735 by State Affairs Committee, Local Administration, Federal Affairs & Special Districts Subcommittee, Andrade (Similar CS/CS/SB 734)

Government Accountability; Prohibits individuals from soliciting or accepting anything of value from foreign country of concern; establishing registration requirements; requiring the commission to make lobbyist registrations available to the public on its website; prohibiting the governing body of a county from renewing or extending the employment contract of the county attorney during a specified timeframe; etc. Effective Date: January 1, 2025

Read second time and amended March 1

CS/HB 781 by Constitutional Rights, Rule of Law & Government Operations Subcommittee, Clemons, López, J. (Identical CS/SB 870)

Unsolicited Proposals for Public-private Partnerships; Authorizes, rather than requires, responsible public entity to publish notice of unsolicited proposal for qualifying project in specified manner & that other proposals for same project will be accepted; authorizes responsible public entity to proceed with unsolicited proposal for qualifying project without public bidding process if responsible public entity holds public meeting that meets certain requirements & holds a subsequent public meeting at which responsible public entity makes certain determination; requires responsible public entity to consider certain factors; requires responsible public entity to publish certain report in Florida Administrative Register for certain period in certain circumstances; revises certain determinations that responsible public entity must make before approving comprehensive agreement. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 7071 by State Affairs Committee, Caruso (Identical SB 7060)

Foreign Investments by the State Board of Administration; Prohibits SBA from acquiring certain holdings on behalf of specified entity; requires board to initiate review of direct holdings; requires board to develop divestment plan & divest of certain holdings. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Read second time March 1

CS/HB 821 by Local Administration, Federal Affairs & Special Districts Subcommittee, Altman

Melbourne-Tillman Water Control District, Brevard County; Revises maximum stormwater management user fees for residential, agricultural, & commercial parcels of land. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Read second time March 1

HB 823 by Maney

North Okaloosa Fire District, Okaloosa County; Authorizes Board of Fire Commissioners of district to establish schedule of impact fees for new construction within its jurisdictional boundaries; provides for use of such impact fees; requires recordkeeping; authorizes agreements with general purpose local governments for certain purposes. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Read second time March 1

HB 1117 by Buchanan

City of North Port, Sarasota County; Creates Star Farms Village at North Port Stewardship District; establishes boundaries; provides for board of supervisors & election, membership, terms, meetings, & duties of board; provides method for transition of board from landowner control to control by resident electors; provides for district manager & treasurer; provides general & special powers of district; provides for bonds, borrowing, future ad valorem taxation, special assessments, issuance of certificates of indebtedness, & tax liens; provides for fees & charges; provides for referendum. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Read second time March 1

CS/HB 1421 by State Affairs Committee, Fine, Black, Roth (Similar SB 1700)

Independent Hospital Districts; Provides requirements for conversion of independent hospital district to nonprofit entity; requires governing body of district to determine by supermajority vote whether conversion is in best interests of its residents within specified time frame; provides for negotiation of agreement between each affected county & independent hospital district; prohibits members of board of commissioners for affected county from serving on board of succeeding nonprofit entity; authorizes members of governing body of independent hospital district to serve on board of succeeding nonprofit entity; authorizes governing body of independent hospital district to approve by supermajority vote conversion of district to nonprofit entity. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

CS/CS/HB 1621 by State Affairs Committee, Local Administration, Federal Affairs & Special Districts Subcommittee, Beltran

Unlawful Demolition of Historical Structures; Authorizes enhanced fines for unlawful demolition of certain historical structures; provides that fines may not exceed specified amount. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

CS/CS/HB 939 by Commerce Committee, Insurance & Banking Subcommittee, Griffitts, Barnaby, Garcia, Salzman, Steele (Compare CS/CS/CS/HB 989, CS/CS/SB 556, CS/CS/CS/B 1066, SB 1132)

Consumer Protection; Specifies requirements for third party settlement organizations that conduct certain transactions; provides additional grounds for qualified public depositories to be suspended & disqualified; provides additional acts deemed knowing & willful violations by qualified public depositories which are subject to certain penalties; authorizes financial institutions to delay disbursement or transaction from account of specified adult under certain circumstances; provides duties of financial institution when such delay is placed; authorizes residential property owner to cancel contracts to replace or repair roof without penalty or obligation within specified timeframe; requirements for notices of contract cancellation; revises definition of term "depository institution"; authorizes customers & members of financial institutions to file certain complaints with OFR. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

CS/HB 17 by Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Rudman, Brannan, Salzman, Yarkosky (Compare SB 1124)

Expiration of the Mandatory Waiting Period for Firearm Purchases; Removes provision authorizing mandatory waiting period to expire upon completion of records check. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 799 by Robinson, W. (Compare CS/SB 814)

Easements Affecting Real Property Owned by Same Owner; Authorizes owner of real property to create easement, servitude, or other interest in owner's real property & providing that such easement, servitude, or other interest is valid; provides that act does not revive or reinstate right or interest that has been adjudicated invalid before certain date. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Read second time and amended March 1

CS/CS/HB 1049 by Judiciary Committee, Regulatory Reform & Economic Development Subcommittee, Hunschofsky, Arrington, Cassel, Cross, Lopez, V., Valdés, Woodson (Similar CS/SB 484)

Flood Disclosure in the Sale of Real Property; Requires seller of residential real property to provide specified information to a prospective purchaser; specifies how such information must be disclosed. Effective Date: October 1, 2024

Read second time March 1

CS/HB 1347 by Commerce Committee, Brackett (Similar CS/SB 1436)

Consumer Finance Loans; Prohibits person from operating branch of business making consumer finance loans before obtaining license; revises maximum interest rates on consumer finance loans; revises minimum amount of time before delinquency charge may be imposed; requires licensees offering assistance program to borrowers after federally declared major disaster to send notice to office; requires licensees to offer to borrowers credit education programs or seminars; provides requirements for licensee claiming submitted information contains trade secret; requires licensees to suspend actions for certain timeframe after federally declared disaster. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

CS/CS/CS/HB 267 by Commerce Committee, Local Administration, Federal Affairs & Special Districts Subcommittee, Regulatory Reform & Economic Development Subcommittee, Esposito, Barnaby, Giallombardo, Rizo (Compare HB 579, HB 1185, CS/CS/CS/SB 684, SB 1130)

Building Regulations; Revises certain support rail requirements; provides certain internship program meets requirements for certain certification; requires Florida Building Commission to modify provisions in FBC relating to certain replacement windows, doors, or garage doors; provides requirements for such modifications; revises provisions, timeframes, & requirements relating to acquiring building permits for residential dwellings; reduces permit fees; authorizes local governments to use certain fees for certain technology upgrades; provides that certain rafter assemblies meet requirements of FBC; requires commission to review law & report findings to the Legislature. Effective Date: January 1, 2025

Cybersecurity; Exempts state chief technology officer from career service; revises purposes for which Florida Digital Service is established; requires state CIO, in consultation with Secretary of Management Services, to designate state chief technology officer; authorizes chairs of certain legislative committees or subcommittees to attend exempt portions of meetings of Florida Cybersecurity Advisory Council if authorized by President of Senate or Speaker of House of Representatives, as applicable; requires state agency & local government to report ransomware & cybersecurity incidents; requires Cybersecurity Operations Center to provide notifications & reports; requires DMS to preserve data & provide aid in certain circumstances; requires DLE to coordinate incident responses; revises membership of Florida Cybersecurity Advisory Council; revises mission & goals of Florida Center for Cybersecurity. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Read second time March 1

CS/HB 1563 by Judiciary Committee, Grant (Compare SB 1778)

Construction Contracting; Requires designated contractors & qualified businesses that receive payments for improvements to residential real property to place such payments in escrow account or provide performance bond; authorizes designated contractor or qualified business to keep funds in same account & withdraw funds; requires designated contractor or qualified business to provide accounting records to owner upon request; provides criminal penalties; requires additional court cost for certain offense & provides for distribution of such cost. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Read second time and amended March 1

CS/CS/HB 1611 by Commerce Committee, Insurance & Banking Subcommittee, Stevenson, LaMarca (Similar CS/CS/SB 1622, Compare HB 1015, CS/CS/HB 1149, CS/CS/SB 1104)

Insurance; Prohibits authorized insurers & eligible surplus lines insurers from canceling & nonrenewing policies covering dwellings & residential properties damaged by covered perils within certain timeframes; provides exceptions to prohibitions against insurers' policy cancellations & nonrenewals within certain timeframes; specifies requirements for rate filings if certain models are used; revises requirements for certain policies issued by Citizens Property Insurance Corporation which are not subject to certain rate increase limitations; revises procedure for persons to organize as domestic reciprocal insurer; requires office to grant authorization for reciprocal insurers to issue nonassessable policies; prohibits persons from acquiring certain securities or ownership interests of certain attorneys in fact & controlling companies of certain attorneys in fact; prohibits domestic stock insurers from converting to reciprocal insurers; authorizes conversion of assessable reciprocal insurers to nonassessable reciprocal insurers; authorizes reciprocal insurers to issue contingent liability policies in another state. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Food Recovery; Directs DACS to implement pilot program to provide incentives to food recovery entities to negotiate price for fresh food products; provides shipping requirements; authorizes food recovery entities to reject certain fresh food products; requires DACS to reimburse food recovery entities for certain costs; requires DACS to submit reports to Governor & Legislature; provides for expiration of pilot program. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Effective Date: July 1, 2024

CS/HB 1105 by Ways & Means Committee, Caruso

Rescinding a Homestead Exemption Application; Authorizes certain taxpayers to rescind homestead exemption applications; provides requirements for such action; requires property appraiser to adjust tax roll. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

CS/HB 1161 by Ways & Means Committee, Arrington, Keen, Daley, Harris, Michael, Stark, Tant, Waldron (Identical CS/CS/SB 172)

Verification of Eligibility for Homestead Exemption; Requires DOR to provide form for specified purpose; authorizing property appraisers to provide tentative verification of eligibility for specified exemptions & discounts; requires such form to indicate specified information; prohibits specified decisions from certain review. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Voter Registration Applications; Provides exception to requirement that certain voter registration applicants must be registered without party affiliation; requires DHSMV to notify individuals of certain information; requires driver license examiner to make specified inquiries; prohibits DHSMV from changing party affiliation of applicant except in certain circumstances; revises methods by which applicant may decline to register to vote; requires DHSMV to ensure that information technology processes & updates do not alter certain information without written consent. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Once more than 10 non-bill sponsor amendments are filed, the allocation of time spent on each non-bill sponsor amendment shall be determined as follows:

- 90 minutes divided by the total number of non-sponsor amendments filed.
- The time allocated for each non-bill sponsor amendment shall be divided equally between the open, questions, debate, and close.
- Amendments withdrawn prior to consideration of the bill don't count toward the total.
