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CS/CS/HB 449 by Judiciary Committee, Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Michael, Bankson, Redondo (Similar CS/SB 1764)

Motor Vehicle Racing Penalties; Increases fine for specified offenses; increases criminal penalty & revising applicability of criminal penalty for second offenses of specified violations occurring within specified time period; provides penalties for impeding, obstructing, or interfering with an emergency vehicle while participating in drag race, street takeover, stunt driving, competition, contest, test, or exhibition; increases penalty for third or subsequent offenses of specified violations occurring within specified time period; increases fine for such violations; increases fine for acting as spectator at specified violations. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

CS/CS/HB 735 by State Affairs Committee, Local Administration, Federal Affairs & Special Districts Subcommittee, Andrade (Similar CS/CS/SB 734)

Government Accountability; Prohibits individuals from soliciting or accepting anything of value from foreign country of concern; establishing registration requirements; requiring the commission to make lobbyist registrations available to the public on its website; prohibiting the governing body of a county from renewing or extending the employment contract of the county attorney during a specified timeframe; etc. Effective Date: January 1, 2025

CS/SB 186 by Health Policy, Brodeur, Pizzo, Wright, Boyd, Burgess, Rouson, Hutson, Davis, Ingoglia, Garcia, Book, Stewart (Similar CS/HB 115)

Progressive Supranuclear Palsy and Other Neurodegenerative Diseases Policy Committee; Citing this act as the “Justo R. Cortes Progressive Supranuclear Palsy Act”; requiring the State Surgeon General to establish a progressive supranuclear palsy and other neurodegenerative diseases policy committee; requiring the Department of Health to provide staff and administrative support to the committee; providing for duties, membership, and meetings of the committee; requiring the State Surgeon General to submit a progress report and a final report by a specified date to the Governor and the Legislature, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 5

CS/CS/SB 66 by Rules, Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Brodeur, Hooper (Identical CS/HB 89)

Revive Awareness Day; Citing this act as “Victoria’s Law”; designating June 6 of each year as “Revive Awareness Day”; authorizing the Governor to issue an annual proclamation; encouraging the Department of Health to hold events to raise awareness of the dangers of opioid overdose and the availability and safe use of opioid antagonists as an effective way to rapidly reverse the effects of opioid overdose, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

CS/CS/CS/SB 1224 by Fiscal Policy, Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Burton (Similar CS/CS/HB 185, Compare HB 673, CS/CS/HB 729, SB 610, CS/CS/CS/SB 638)

Protection of Children and Victims of Crime; Requiring the Statewide Guardian ad Litem Office and circuit guardian ad litem offices to participate in the development of a certain state plan; requiring the court to appoint a guardian ad litem for a child at the earliest possible time; requiring parents to consent to provide certain information to the guardian ad litem and attorney ad litem; requiring a court to appoint a guardian ad litem to represent a child in certain proceedings, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time and amended March 5

CS/SB 644 by Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services, Simon (Similar CS/HB 309)

Rural Emergency Hospitals; Subjecting rural emergency hospitals to certain requirements for the provision of emergency services and care; defining the terms “rural emergency hospital” and “rural emergency services”; authorizing qualifying hospitals to apply to the Agency for Health Care Administration for designation as a rural emergency hospital, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 5

CS/CS/SB 564 by Fiscal Policy, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Garcia, Hooper, Book, Rouson (Similar HB 631)

Young Adult Aftercare Services; Revising eligibility requirements for aftercare services for certain young adults; authorizing the Department of Children and Families to distribute federal funds to eligible young adults in certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

CS/CS/SB 1758 by Fiscal Policy, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Brodeur, President Passidomo, Albritton, Avila, Baxley, Boyd, Bradley, Broxson, Burgess, Burton, Calatayud, Collins, Davis, DiCeglie, Garcia, Grall, Gruters, Harrell, Hooper, Hutson, Ingoglia, Jones, Martin, Mayfield, Osgood, Perry, Pizzo, Polsky, Powell, Rodriguez, Rouson, Simon, Stewart, Thompson, Torres, Trumbull, Wright, Yarborough, Book (Similar CS/CS/CS/HB 1271, Compare HB 1047, SB 1170)

Individuals with Disabilities; Revising provisions related to programs and services provided by the Agency for Persons with Disabilities; requiring the agency, within available resources, to offer voluntary participation care navigation services to clients and their caregivers at specified times; requiring the agency to develop and implement an online application process; revising which types of clients are eligible for an individual support plan; clarifying the timeframe within which a family or individual support plan must be developed, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 5

CS/SB 1112 by Health Policy, Harrell (Similar CS/HB 1295)

Health Care Practitioner Titles and Designations; Providing that, for specified purposes, the use of specified titles or designations in connection with one's name constitutes the practice of medicine or the practice of osteopathic medicine; revising grounds for disciplinary action relating to a practitioner's use of such titles or designations in identifying himself or herself to patients or in advertisements for health care services; requiring certain health care practitioners to prominently display a copy of their license in a conspicuous area of their practice, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

CS/CS/CS/SB 1582 by Fiscal Policy, Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services, Health Policy, Rodriguez (Compare CS/CS/HB 1441, HB 1497, HB 7085, SB 1300, SB 7070, CS/SB 7072)

Department of Health; Exempting environmental health technicians from certain certification requirements under certain circumstances; creating the Andrew John Anderson Pediatric Rare Disease Grant Program within the department for a specified purpose; providing that any health care practitioner present at a birth or responsible for primary care during the neonatal period has the primary responsibility of administering certain screenings; revising hearing loss screening requirements to include infants and toddlers; requiring the department to grant certain applicants 90 days to cure deficiencies with their medical marijuana treatment center license applications pursuant to a specified errors and omissions process, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2024

CS/SB 330 by Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services, Boyd, Rouson (Similar CS/HB 1617)

Behavioral Health Teaching Hospitals; Creating part VI of ch. 395, F.S., entitled "Behavioral Health Teaching Hospitals"; authorizing hospitals to apply for a behavioral health teaching hospital designation beginning on a specified date; requiring the agency to award behavioral health teaching hospitals certain funds upon their designation; providing for expiration and renewal of behavioral health teaching hospital designations, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2024

Read second time and amended March 5

CS/SB 7072 by Fiscal Policy, Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services (Similar HB 7087, Compare CS/CS/CS/SB 1582)

Cancer Funding; Revising the purpose of the Casey DeSantis Cancer Research Program; revising duties of the Department of Health under the program; creating the Cancer Connect Collaborative, a council, within the department for a specified purpose; requiring the collaborative to advise the department on the awarding of grants issued through the Cancer Innovation Fund; requiring the collaborative to review grant applications and make recommendations to the department for awarding grants upon the appropriation of funds to the fund, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 5

SB 7078 by Fiscal Policy, Harrell (Compare HB 7087)

Public Records and Meetings/Cancer Research Grant Applications; Providing an exemption from public records requirements for proprietary business information included in cancer research grant applications submitted to the Cancer Connect Collaborative and records generated by the collaborative relating to the review of such information; providing an exemption from public meeting requirements for portions of collaborative meetings during which such proprietary business information is discussed; providing for legislative review and repeal of the exemptions; providing statements of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 7072 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

CS/CS/SB 736 by Fiscal Policy, Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development, Trumbull (Similar CS/CS/HB 247, Compare CS/CS/HB 817, SB 840)

Services Provided by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles or Its Agents; Providing that a certain affidavit establishes a presumption of ownership and right of possession to a motor vehicle or mobile home when the previous owner of the motor vehicle or mobile home died testate; prohibiting the department or a tax collector from charging a fee for reissuance of certain certificates of title; authorizing certain disabled veterans to be issued a military license plate or specialty license plate in lieu of a "DV" license plate; authorizing the department to design, issue, and regulate the use of temporary tags when the existing owner of a vehicle has submitted an application to transfer a valid out-of-state title that is subject to a lien, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2024

CS/CS/SB 1084 by Fiscal Policy, Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government, Collins (Similar CS/CS/HB 1071, Compare HB 119, HB 435, SB 188, SB 586)

Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; Preempting the regulation of electric vehicle charging stations to the state; prohibiting local governmental entities from enacting or enforcing such regulations; providing that a pest control operator's certificate, a special identification card, and certain limited certifications for pesticide applicators, respectively, expire a specified length of time after issuance; authorizing the department to take disciplinary action against a person who swears to or affirms a false statement on certain applications, cheats on a required examination, or violates certain procedures under certain circumstances; authorizing Class "G" licensees to qualify for multiple calibers of firearms in one requalification class under certain circumstances; prohibiting the manufacture for sale, sale, holding or offering for sale, or distribution of cultivated meat in this state, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2024

SB 7026 by Agriculture

Public Records/Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; Providing an exemption from public records requirements for certain information held by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Read second time March 5

CS/CS/SB 994 by Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development, Transportation, Burgess (Similar CS/CS/HB 1045, Compare CS/HB 7039, CS/SB 7002)

Student Transportation Safety; Revising requirements for signage posted on the rear of a school bus indicating the use of a school bus infraction detection system; requiring a law enforcement agency to send a notice of violation to the registered owner involved in a violation within a specified timeframe after receiving certain information; prohibiting the use of school bus infraction detection systems for remote surveillance; requiring that certain civil penalties be remitted to a participating school district operating a school bus with a school bus infraction detection system to be used for certain purposes, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Read second time March 5

CS/CS/SB 556 by Rules, Banking and Insurance, Rouson, Book (Similar CS/CS/HB 515)

Protection of Specified Adults; Authorizing financial institutions, under certain circumstances, to delay a disbursement or transaction from an account of a specified adult; specifying that a delay on a disbursement or transaction expires on a certain date; authorizing the financial institution to extend the delay under certain circumstances; authorizing a court of competent jurisdiction to shorten or extend the delay, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2025

Read second time and amended March 5

CS/CS/SB 1628 by Fiscal Policy, Community Affairs, Collins (Compare CS/HB 1547)

Local Government Actions; Requiring that certain bond referenda called by a county, district, or municipality be held at a general election; revising applicability provisions for the enactment or adoption of county and municipal ordinances, respectively, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Read second time March 5

CS/CS/SB 1380 by Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services, Transportation, Hutson (Similar CS/CS/HB 1673)

Transportation Services for Persons with Disabilities and the Transportation Disadvantaged; Revising duties of the Department of Transportation, within specified resources, with respect to required provisions of grants and agreements with entities providing paratransit services; defining the term “transportation service provider”; providing requirements for paratransit service contracts entered into on or after October 1, 2024; requiring the commission to develop requirements for the investigation of adverse incidents, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Read second time and amended March 5

CS/SB 1698 by Agriculture, Burton (Identical CS/CS/HB 1613)

Food and Hemp Products; Defining the term “total delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol concentration”; providing conditions for the manufacture, delivery, hold, offer for sale, distribution, or sale of hemp extract; prohibiting businesses and food establishments from possessing hemp extract products that are attractive to children; prohibiting the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services from granting permission to remove or use certain hemp extract products until it determines that such hemp extract products comply with state law, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Read second time and amended March 5

CS/CS/SB 1264 by Appropriations Committee on Education, Education Pre-K -12, Collins, Rodriguez, Harrell, Avila (Similar CS/CS/HB 1349)

History of Communism; Requiring instruction in public schools on the history of communism; creating the Institute for Freedom in the Americas at Miami Dade College; renaming the Adam Smith Center for the Study of Economic Freedom as the Adam Smith Center for Economic Freedom; requiring the Department of State, in collaboration with the Department of Education, to consult with stakeholders to provide a recommendation to the Legislature by a specified date for the creation of a museum of the history of communism, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 5

SB 46 by Stewart (Identical HB 315)

Reading Achievement Initiative for Scholastic Excellence Program; Providing that tutoring provided through the tutoring program established as part of the Reading Achievement Initiative for Scholastic Excellence Program may be provided after the school day; authorizing school districts that participate in the tutoring program to provide a stipend to instructional personnel and high school students who serve as tutors under the program, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 5

CS/SB 7032 by Appropriations, Education Postsecondary (Similar CS/CS/HB 7051, Compare SB 2516)

Education; Establishing the Graduation Alternative to Traditional Education (GATE) Program within the Department of Education; revising the services to which the one-stop delivery system is intended to provide access; requiring a student’s certified school counselor or other school personnel to inform the student of opportunities in the GATE Program; requiring district school boards to notify all candidates for the high school equivalency diploma of adult secondary and postsecondary education options, including specified eligibility requirements; creating the GATE Scholarship Program; requiring the department to administer the program, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time and amended March 5

CS/SB 62 by Education Postsecondary, Osgood, Book (Identical CS/HB 767)

Resident Status for Tuition Purposes; Providing that a person may not lose his or her resident status for tuition purposes due to incarceration, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 5

SB 958 by Martin, Perry (Similar CS/HB 505, Compare CS/CS/CS/HB 1083, CS/CS/SB 1486)

Local Government Employees; Revising the base salary used to calculate the compensation of county tax collectors; defining the term “tax collector employee”; providing that tax collector employees are eligible to receive specified monetary benefits from the state for adopting children within the child welfare system; revising the base salary used to calculate the compensation of district school superintendents, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 5

SB 548 by Collins (Identical HB 319, Compare SB 308)

Public Records/Military Personnel and their Spouses and Dependents; Providing an exemption from public records requirements for identification and location information of certain current and former military personnel and their spouses and dependents; providing for retroactive application of the exemption; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Read second time March 5

CS/CS/SB 224 by Rules, Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Wright (Similar CS/HB 413)

Citizen Volunteer Advisory Committees; Authorizing specified regional citizen volunteer advisory committees to conduct public meetings and workshops by means of communications media technology; requiring that such technology allow all persons to audibly communicate; providing notice requirements for public meetings or workshops conducted by means of communications media technology, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Read second time March 5

SB 674 by Boyd (Similar HB 779)

United States-produced Iron and Steel in Public Works Projects; Requiring governmental entities to include a requirement in certain contracts that certain iron or steel products be produced in the United States; authorizing the minimal use of foreign steel and iron materials in certain circumstances; exempting specified products from the requirement, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 5

SB 7030 by Governmental Oversight and Accountability (Compare HB 1391, HB 7043, SB 1632)

Public Records/Agency for Health Care Administration Personnel; Providing an exemption from public records requirements for the personal identifying and location information of certain current or former personnel of the Agency for Health Care Administration and their spouses and children; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; abrogating the scheduled repeal of exemptions for certain personal identifying and location information of specified agency personnel, and the spouses and children thereof; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Read second time and amended March 5

SB 276 by Avila (Identical HB 1211)

Review of Advisory Bodies; Requiring certain executive agencies to annually upload a report to a specified website maintained by the Executive Office of the Governor by a specified date; providing requirements for such report; providing that specified provisions are subject to repeal, unless reviewed and saved from repeal by the Legislature within a specified timeframe, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 5

SJR 1114 by Hutson (Identical HJR 7059, Compare HB 7061)

Public Financing for Campaigns of Candidates for Elective Statewide Office; Proposing the repeal of Section 7 of Article VI of the State Constitution which requires the availability of public financing for campaigns of candidates for elective statewide office who agree to campaign spending limits, etc.

Read second time March 5

SB 1116 by Hutson (Identical HB 7061, Compare HJR 7059)

Campaign Finance; Repealing provisions relating to the Florida Election Campaign Financing Act; deleting provisions governing the public funding of campaigns for candidates for statewide office who agree to certain expenditure limits, etc. Effective Date: On the effective date of the amendment to the State Constitution proposed by SJR 1114 or a similar joint resolution having substantially the same specific intent and purpose if such an amendment to the State Constitution is approved by the electors at the next general election or at an earlier special election specifically authorized by law for that purpose

SB 1720 by Rodriguez (Identical HB 1407)

Marine Encroachment on Military Operations; Requiring local governments to cooperate with certain major military installations and ranges to encourage compatible land use in associated areas, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 5

CS/SB 1746 by Rules, Ingoglia (Similar CS/HB 1471)

Public Employees; Revising a prohibition on dues to certain mass transit employees; providing that specified employee organizations have the right to have its dues and uniform assessments deducted and collected by the employer from the salaries of those employees who authorized such deduction and collection; revising the application employee organizations must submit to register as certified bargaining agents; providing transitional provisions regarding the renewal of registration of employee organizations during a specified timeframe, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law

Read second time March 5

CS/SB 7014 by Rules, Ethics and Elections (Similar CS/HB 1597)

Ethics; Increasing the maximum fine for violations of specified lobbying provisions; authorizing attorneys who file full and public disclosures of their financial interests to indicate that a client meets disclosure criteria without providing further information relating to such client; prohibiting a member of the Commission on Ethics from serving more than two full terms, instead of two full terms in succession; providing that a complainant is liable for costs plus reasonable attorney fees for filing a complaint with malicious intent against a candidate for public office; requiring that allegations in written complaints submitted to the commission be based upon personal knowledge or information other than hearsay, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Read second time and amended March 5

SB 818 by Avila, Collins (Similar HB 765)

Military Leave; Providing that public officials and employees of the state, a county, a municipality, or a political subdivision, respectively, are entitled to their full pay for the first 30 days of military service, if such service is equal to or greater than a specified timeframe, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 5

SB 702 by Martin (Similar CS/HB 1167)

Attorney Fees and Costs; Defining the term “property rights”; requiring courts to award reasonable attorney fees and costs to a prevailing defendant in certain civil actions under specified circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Read second time March 5

CS/SB 278 by Fiscal Policy, Martin (Similar CS/CS/HB 979)

Estoppel Certificates; Prohibiting agreements that indemnify a community association manager or community association management firm for errors or omissions relating to the provision or preparation of an estoppel certificate; revising acts that constitute grounds for which certain disciplinary actions may be taken to include specified actions relating to estoppel certificates; revising the time in which a community association must provide an estoppel certificate to a requestor, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time and amended March 5

SB 184 by Avila, Hooper (Similar CS/HB 75)

Impeding, Threatening, or Harassing First Responders; Defining the terms “first responder” and “harass”; prohibiting a person, after receiving a warning not to approach from a first responder who is engaged in the lawful performance of a legal duty, from violating such warning and approaching or remaining within a specified distance of the first responder with specified intent, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Read second time and amended March 5

CS/CS/SB 1036 by Fiscal Policy, Criminal Justice, Ingoglia (Similar CS/HB 1449)

Reclassification of Criminal Penalties; Requiring reclassification of the penalty for the commission of a felony committed by a person who has a previous specified conviction; defining the term “transnational crime organization”; authorizing reclassification of the penalty for any misdemeanor or felony offense if the commission of such offense was for specified purposes, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Read second time March 5

CS/CS/CS/SB 718 by Fiscal Policy, Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice, Criminal Justice, Collins, Hooper (Similar CS/CS/HB 231)

Exposures of First Responders to Fentanyl and Fentanyl Analogs; Providing criminal penalties for adults who, in the course of unlawfully possessing specified controlled substances, recklessly expose a first responder to such substances and an overdose or serious bodily injury of the first responder results; prohibiting the arrest, charging, prosecution, or penalizing under specified provisions of law of a person acting in good faith who seeks medical assistance for an individual experiencing, or believed to be experiencing, an alcohol-related or a drug-related overdose, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Read second time March 5

SB 1512 by Brodeur (Identical HB 1595)

Controlled Substances; Adding tianeptine to the list of Schedule I controlled substances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 5

CS/SB 984 by Judiciary, Rouson (Similar CS/HB 175)
