HB 7047: Deregulation of Professions and Occupations

HB 7047 amends current law relating to certain professions and business organizations regulated by the Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR).

The bill removes certain professions and entities from DBPR regulation.

- Removes the following professions and entities from DBPR regulation:

 Interior designers, hair braiders, hair wrappers, body wrappers, boxing announcers, and boxing timekeepers.
- Removes the following professions and entities from DBPR regulation, but generally retains each profession's standards of operation and civil and criminal causes of action:
 - Labor organizations, business agents, talent agencies, and auctioneers.

The bill eases regulations on certain professions.

- Reduces the hours of training required to obtain the following licenses:
 - Barbers, restricted barbers, nail specialists, facial specialists, and full specialists.
- Clarifies the definition and scope of practice for the following professions:
 - Restricted barbers, nail specialists, full specialists, facial specialists, and hair braiders.
- Eliminates the requirement that the following licensees obtain a certificate of authorization for their businesses, and allows such licensees to continue to operate if they apply to be the qualifying agent for their business entity:
 - Asbestos abatement consultants and contractors, architects, landscape architects, and geologists.
- Eliminates the requirement that yacht and ship brokers obtain a separate license for each branch office, but retains the requirement that a primary office location be maintained.
